QUEST-NORTHWEST


Geoscience BC launched QUEST-Northwest in April 2011. The QUEST-Northwest area is host to a number of known mineral deposits and remains a highly prospective area for the discovery of new copper, gold, silver and molybdenum resources. The project aims to compile and update existing data sets as well as provide new geoscience data to help focus exploration.


The 2011 QUEST-Northwest geophysical program included two airborne magnetic surveys, in the Dease Lake and Telegraph Creek areas (Block 1 and Block 2). Geoscience BC released this data at Roundup 2012. New mapping (partnership with the BCGS) and geochemical data were also released in 2012.


AIRBORNE MAGNETIC SURVEY


In 2012 Geoscience BC flew a third airborne magnetic survey in the QUEST-Northwest project area. Flown with by Geo Data Solutions GDS Inc. at a 250 m line-spacing, the survey has the same specifications as the two 2011 surveys. The survey covered approximately 1200 km² near Iskut, BC.


This new data was released as Geoscience BC Report 2013-03 this morning. The report also includes 2200 line-km of airborne magnetic data purchased from New Chris Minerals Ltd. This data set was collected in late 2011 and early 2012 at a 100 m line-spacing, and lies in the center of the QUEST-Northwest Block 3 area.
